Surveyed February 23<sup>rd</sup> 1839 for Daniel Shawen. Beginning  
 at John's E. Corner, a small black Walnut on the side of  
 the creek or Run; thence North 25 chain to a white oak  
 18 L. 20<sup>o</sup> S 44 E 19. Hickory 5 L. 20<sup>o</sup> S 82 W 30 Links in the North  
 Line of the Section; thence N 89 W 25 chain to the quarter  
 Section Corner between sq. 10. a Wh. Oak 15 L. 20<sup>o</sup> S 40 E 15  
 Links other bearing true down. Thence South 40 chain 30 L  
 to the South West Corner of the q. S. of which this is part.  
 Thence S 89 E 12 chain 50 links to a Stake in a Prairie; thence  
 N 10 3/4 W 10 ch. to a black Walnut 20 L. 20<sup>o</sup> S 11 W 40 Links - then  
 N 70 E 13.08 chain to a Stake; thence N 20 W 1.25 chain to a  
 Stake; thence S 41 E 4.24 to the beginning. 81 1/2 acres.

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Surveyor's Office Bellefontaine O. Oct. 25<sup>th</sup> 1857  
 The above Plat represents Sect. No. 3  
 of Town No. 3 & Range No. 14.

The two black lines, whose bearings and  
 distances are given, represent a Survey, made on  
 the 10<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> days of Oct. 1857, by me, H. C. Moore,  
 Co. Surveyor - of Logan Co. O. For James Walker,  
 for the purpose of establishing the North  
 West, North East, & South East corners, and the  
 lines on the East side & North end of the  
 East half, of the South East Quarter, of  
 said Section No. three of Town No. three &  
 Range No. fourteen E. & N. R. S. done as  
 follows:

Beginning at a stake in a Co. Road at the N. E.  
 corner of said Section No. three; where

I found a White Oak 24 in diam. N. 50° E  
 53 links distant, & having marks of an original  
 witness; and a W. Oak stump S. 61° W. 13 links  
 which John Royer Sen. told me (at the time of  
 this survey) was the stump of an original  
 witness; thence run with the East line of  
 said Sect. No. 3 S 1° W. 80.  $\frac{36}{100}$  chains  
 to the South East corner of said Sect. 3,  
 where I planted a stone in the presence  
 of John Royer Sen. John Lindsey, J. J.  
 Smith & Mr. Burkhardt Jr. There I found  
 a Red Oak 24 in diam. N. 78° W. 28 links  
 having marks of an original witness, &  
 which I believe to be one of the trees  
 described in the original field notes  
 as a B Oak; But I found no Black  
 or Bur Oaks, or any sign of such near  
 the place of this corner. I also measured  
 from the corner stone to two W. Oaks  
 to which gates are hung, as follows;  
 to wit; a W. Oak 16 in di. S 42° E. 9 links,  
 and a W. Oak 18 in di. S. 22° W. 22 links  
 Then came back to the middle of said  
 East line, and planted a small stone  
 S. 3 brick-bats, in the presence of  
 Legran Harman, J. J. Smith, John  
 Lindsey, John Royer Sen. John Royer Jr.  
 and David Kaylor; as a monument  
 for the N. E. corner of James Walker's 80  
 acre lot, & S. E. corner to John Royer's  
 N. E. Quarter of the said Sect. No. 3.  
 Witness; B. Hickory 7 in di. S 41° W. 3 links  
 and an apple tree 5 in di. S 78° W. 61 links;  
 Thence run N. 88° 40' W. 40.  $\frac{28}{100}$  chains to a  
 stone at the established corner in the  
 centre of the section; passing a stone

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at  $20\frac{17}{100}$  chains, which had been planted  
as the division corner between the East &  
West halves of the S. E. quarter of  
said sect. No. three, when it was first  
divided between David & Joseph  
Kayler.
