At the instance of John Clingerman
 Esq. dated Oct 10th 1846 the following
 corners between John Clingerman and
 Job Mathews & Co. having first signed an
 agreement waiving notices & authorizing
 evidence to be taken. Beginning at the North
 East corner of Survey No 3453 and run
 S 32° 12' E 100 poles to a Red Oak & White
 Elm which William Thomas testified
 to be the corner together with a Sugar (hard
 pine) marked by Wm Sullivan as the corner
 stub of two hundred acres of land deeded
 to Nathaniel Thomas by Jym starting
 as Administrator of J Sullivan; then
 run S 55° 48' W 100 poles to a point near
 a Jym & Grey ash which point said
 Wm Thomas testifies to be the corner, he
 being present when it & last mention
 ed corner were first made by Wm Sulli-
 van & Surveyor. Planted 8 Corns at each
 corner. Present at planting both, Wm
 Evans, Wm Thomas, John McCally
 & Jas S Curt.

 29th 1849 a tract of land out of Lucas Sulli-
 vants Survey N^o 3753 on the waters of Dodge
 and beginning at a stone between two
 Sugar trees in the Eastline of said survey-
 and N 52° E 75 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles from the S.E. corner
 of said survey, thence N 52° E 31 poles to a stone
 at the S.E. corner to Kendall Buffmans Plot.
 thence N 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 76 poles to a stone at said Buff-
 mans S.W. corner; thence N 31 $\frac{1}{4}$ W 87 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to a
 stone at Silas Evans' S.E. corner; thence N 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ W
 84 poles to a stone in an angle of said Evans line.
 Thence S 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 118 poles to a stone near a
 large poplar and in the South line of
 Sullivants said Survey N^o 3753. thence S 55°
 317 poles to a stone near a white Elm, and
 corner to a lot sold by said Stratton to Joseph
 Evans; thence N 66° E 38 poles to a stone in
 an angle of said Joseph Evans line; thence
 N 81° E 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to the place of beginning
 containing 165 Acres. at the same time and
 on presentation of the following notice.

 take notice that on the 29th day of Sept
 1849 the Surveyor of Logan County will be
 present at the corners of the land form-
 erly owned by by me, at 8 O'clock A.M.
 to take depositions and establish corners
 to the same.

 I proceeded to take the following deposition

Depositions of witnesses taken to establish the corners of Joel Stratton's land and to perpetuate the evidence of the same. Said land is situate in Military Survey No. 3753 on the waters of Darby in Logan County, in pursuance of the notice herewith attached and at the time and place therein mentioned in the presence of Joel Stratton, Mr. Evans, Joseph Evans, Kendall Steffman and others who own land adjoining and who had an opportunity to partake in the questioning of the witnesses I proceeded to take the following depositions:

Mr. W. Haines of the County of Union of lawful age and C. H. Austin and Silas J. Evans of Logan County being first duly sworn deposed as follows.

Mr. W. Haines

Q by Stratton What do you know relative to the S. E. corner of Lucas Sullivants Survey No. 3753 on Darby?

Ans. I was with Sullivant as chain carrier when he surveyed a tract of land for Joseph Stratton in the S. E. corner of his Survey No. 3753.

Q by same How long is that since?

Ans. It was in 1817 or 32 years ago.

Q by same Can you point out the place where said corner was made?

Ans. I can within about a half rod of a large white ash.

Q by same Who owned the land on East side of said corner when it was made?

Ans. Moses Evans.

Cross examined.
Q by Joseph Evans Have you any recollection of any other corner trees except the Sash?

Ans. I have not.
Q by same Have you any recollection of any line trees on the East line of Sullivants Survey?

Ans. I recollect a white elm on the bank of Mill Branch.

Carlisle H. Austin, deposed as follows.

Q by Stratton. What do you know about the large white ash mentioned by Mr. Hains at the S. E. corner of Survey No 3753?

Ans. I surveyed up to said Ash as a corner about 40 or 5 years ago and found marks on it indicating that it had been marked as an original corner.

Cross Examined

Q By Joseph Evans. Have you any recollection of any other trees at said corner?

Ans. There was also a Sycm marked, standing in a westerly direction from said Ash

Silas V. Evans, being also sworn deposed as follows.

Q By Joseph Evans. Have you any recollection of the corner trees at the S. E. corner of Silas Sullivants Survey No 3753 and the S. W. corner of Robt. Powers Survey No 3680 on Darby creek?

Ans. I have a recollection of said corner for the last 40 years. it was marked on a white Ash, Sycm, and Buckeyes.

Q by same, Can you point out said trees?

Ans: I can point out
 I can show where the Ash and Lynn
 and show within 3 feet of where
 the Buckeye stood - the Buckeye
 stood N of the Lynn and Ash and
 within 3 feet of where I now stand.

Cross Examined
 I by Stratton. Are you interested in the
 establishment of the aforementio-
 ed corner?

Ans. I am not.

 ly subscribed were reduced to writing
 by me and taken at the time and
 place specified in the foregoing notice.
 In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand, this 27th day of September 1849 -

In pursuance of the foregoing depositions and
 the old marks found along the south line of Survey
 No. 35753 and 3680 east of No. 35753 and the line
 running between these surveys; the marks
 found on the line running easterly and
 westwardly past said corner, are to
 be found on two sugar trees standing
 west of said Stratton's Orchard and on
 some sugar tree and a White Walnut
 in Joseph Evans' "Sugar camp lot"

and the marks on the line between the two surveys, are to be found on a large White Oak and some Beeches in Esqr. Mr. Evans' woods pasture, (In pursuance) of all the foregoing facts evidences of old lines &c. and in the presence of Mr. Evans Esq. James Charleston, Alfred Morton, Joseph Goul Levi Evans, Edwin Morton, John Walker, William Norrell and others I planted a large stone as the S.E. corner of said Survey No. 3753 and as the S.W. corner of Robt. Powers' Survey No. 3680 about a half mile westerly from the stump of the large White ash (the tree having recently been cut down) mentioned by all of the witnesses in the foregoing depositions and S52°W 410 poles from the N.E. corner of said Survey No. 3753 which corner is a large stone near a large Poplar and S35°E 490 poles from the S.W. corner of said Survey this corner is marked on Red Oak Gynn and Sugar tree - all of which is represented by the following plat together with Stratton's individual tract
