 the owner of the adjoining lands, ever since the Survey, of
 which you speak, was made by said Garwood? Ans.
 by same - I never heard it disputed until recently -

Question by Joshua Phelps - Was John Garwood Jr., the owner
 of the ~~land~~^{in the} tract, present when the corner was made by the
 Surveyor as aforesaid - Answer by same - I think he was
 not present - Question by same - Did James W. Mc-
 Mullan, former County Surveyor, ever run a line from out
 this corner through the original Survey, and if so when?
 Answer by same - He did about 3 years since run from
 the corner opposite on the eastern line to this corner -

Question by Joseph S. Curtis - Who shewed the corner to said
 Mullan when he run the line of which you speak?

Answer by same - Henry Skarman & the Surveyor having
 come out Southbury from this corner from 5 to 7 miles -

Question by same - Is a Henry Skarman admit this
 corner to be his when James W. McMullan run the line?
 Answer by same - Yes, that was my understanding that
 this admission was made by Skarman & Cudworth -
 and further the deponent said not

A. B. Dillor -

Also at the same time and place came David R. Dillon
of Sauc County, & of lawful age, & after being duly affirmed
depose & says in answer to interrogatories. Question by Surveyor
How long have you been acquainted with the estates of

a corner at this point. Answer by Deponent - About three years.

I was present when James W. Maines run the line thro the
Survey to this point. Question by same. Were any of the corner
trees standing at that time, and if so, how were they
marked? Answer by same, the corner tree was all gone
at that time, except the body of a Hickory, which was then
said to be the corner having hicks upon it like a Military
corner. And I supposed it to be a corner tree, & having been
shown me for a corner. Question by same. Who showed you
this corner? Answer by same Henry Scammon -

Question by Joseph Hart. When the corner was shown
you by Henry Scammon, did he admit it to be the corner
between his land and mine? Answer by same
Yes. Scammon & one both admitted the corner at that
time. Question by same Do you recollect if James Maines
then directed me to drive a stake at the corner at the time
he made the Survey, and if I did so? Answer by same
I think I do recollect that Maines told you to drive a
stake, but then you did so I do not recollect

Also at same time & place, at 13 on the flat in this
Survey came Job Shaps of Sauc County, 90 year and

to interrogatories, deposes, & says. Question by Surveyor
What do you know of this corner, by whom was it made,
when, and upon what kind of timber was it marked?

Answer by Deponent - I know that this was always, for
thirty years past, Considered the corner between lands
grantedly owned by my Father John Shaps, and Thomas
James S. formerly called Mc Connell's tract, but I
do not know on what timber it was marked, or by whom
made. Question by same How did you understand
this corner was to be placed between your Father and

answ the Mr Connell tract in reference to the original
 Corner of the Survey? Answer by Saml I understand
 this w^t to be the Center corner between the original
 corners. Question by Saml. Did you ever know the
 precise point at which this corner was understood to
 be placed, or ever see any marks which you under-
 stood to be corner marks? Answer by Saml. I do not
 know the precise point, but believe it to be within one w^t
 of the end of the line just measured from the stone planted
 at A. I never saw any marks which I knew to be corner

 At the original tree being all downy gone excepting the
 root of a Hickory, after having taken the definition of A
 B. Dillor of David B. Dillor I proceeded to plant a stone post
 which a Hickory 24 inches diameter bears 6576 37 links and
 a Buck 12 inches diameter bears 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 78 links, at the
 planting of which were present there a James Joshua
 Sharp Henry Scammon Joseph S. Carr John Sharp Job
 Sharp, William Grub, David B. Dillor, Abraham
 B. Dillor - then measured the line A B S 35 6 64 pole, at
 the end of which took the deposition of Job Sharp John
